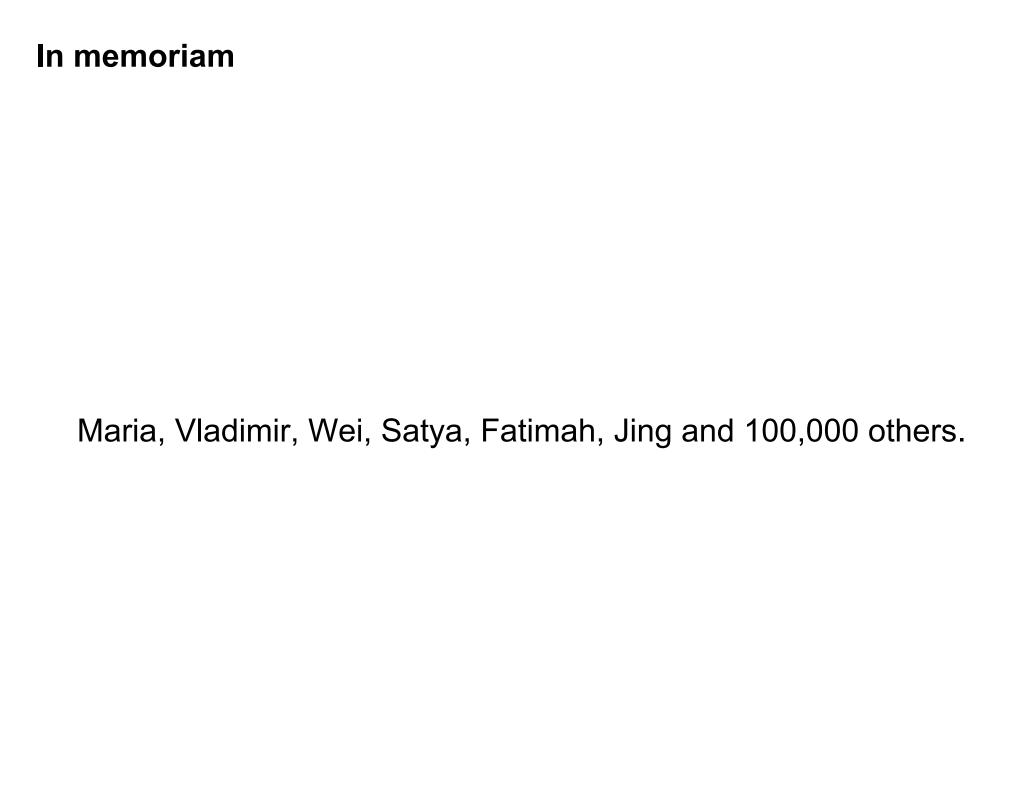

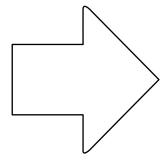
Economic consequences: health care and the length of economic activity



Each week, one weekend more

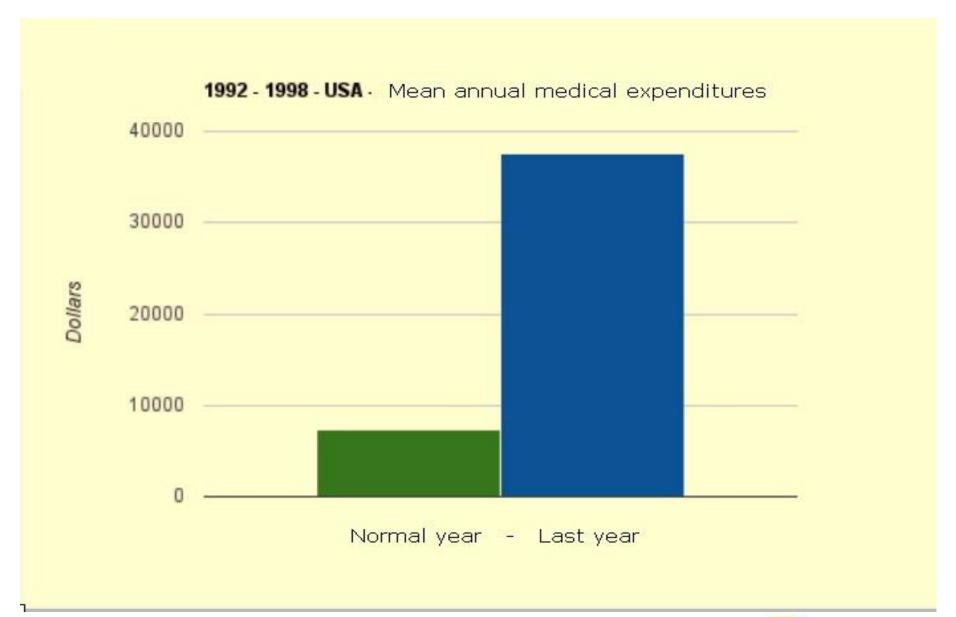
Life expectancy in good health is also rising

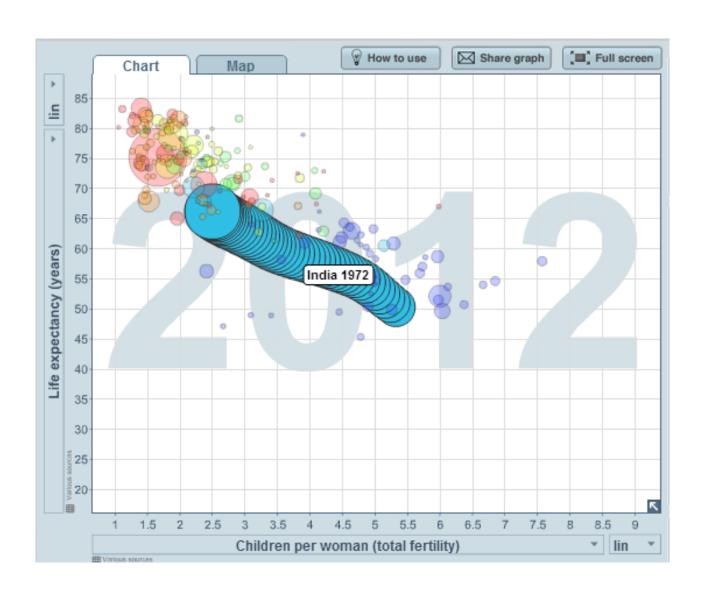

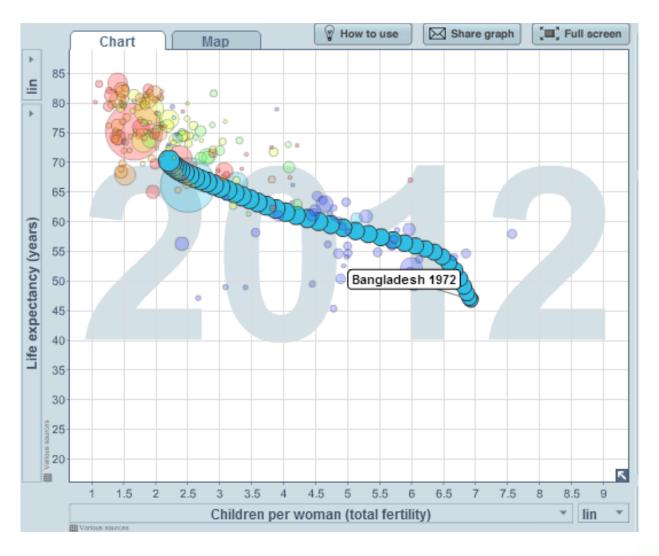

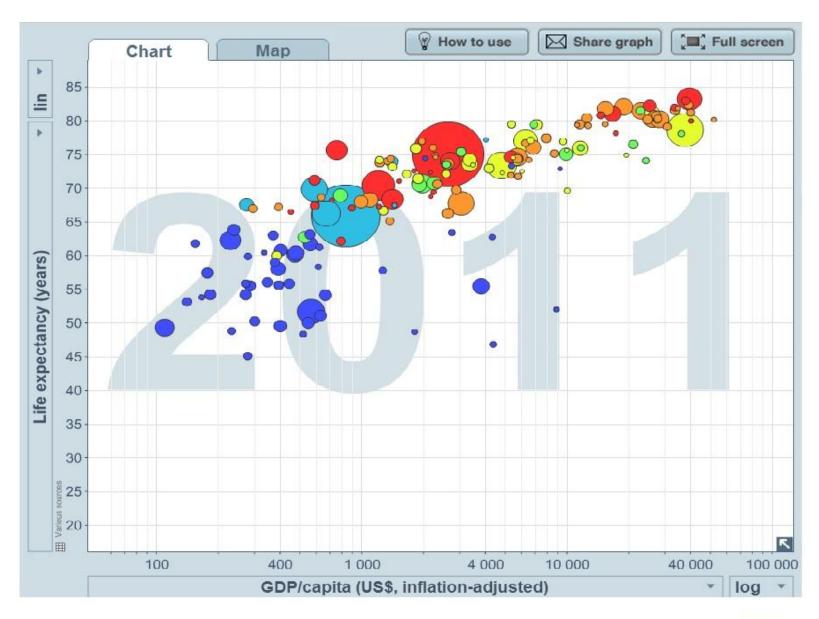


Last 40 years: Bangladesh

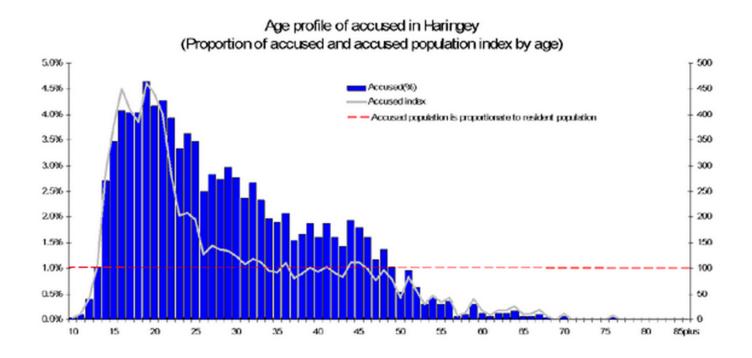
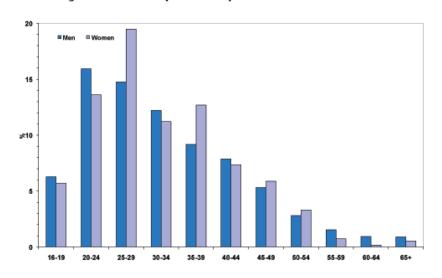


Chart 4 Age distribution of prisoners by sex: 30 June 2010

Article 25. Universal Declaration of Human Rights.

Everyone has the right to a standard of living adequate for the health and well-being of himself and of his family, including food, clothing, housing and medical care and necessary social services, and the right to security in the event of unemployment, sickness, disability, widowhood, old age or other lack of livelihood in circumstances beyond his control.

A human right in progress



Political choices concerning the technological progress are very important

- Sometimes, we have very fast accelerations:
 1957: Spoutnik 1969: first man on the moon
- Sometimes progressions slow down
 Transportation: 1927 1970 Versus 1970 2013
- Concerning aging: it depends on societal / political decisions (and not only on Moore's law)



The state(s) must subsidize and promote life extension

- For ethical reasons: priority to vulnerable people.
- One cent against aging is one cent for (almost) everybody
- For stability reasons: A society in which poor people might think they will continue to die while rich people escape mortality due to old age could be profoundly disruptive.

A society with more resilient people, living a lot longer, people knowing that they will be able to go on for long if they care for themselves and for others, is probably one of the nicest futures that we can imagine.
