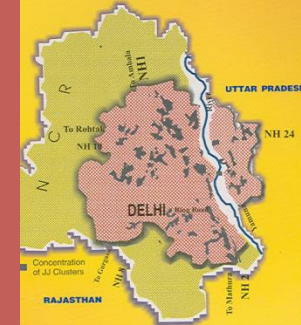

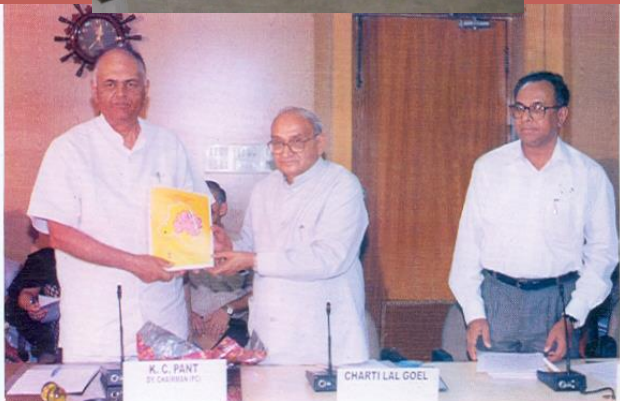

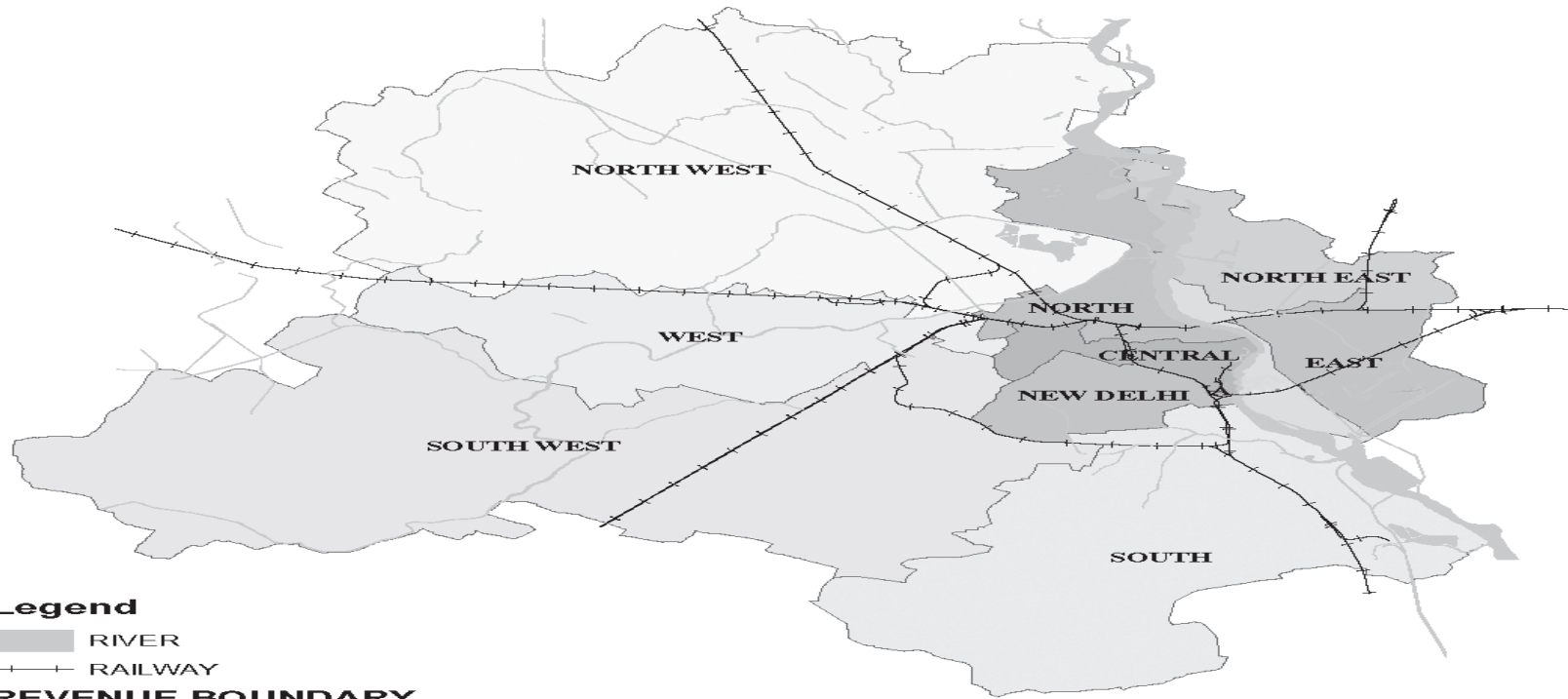

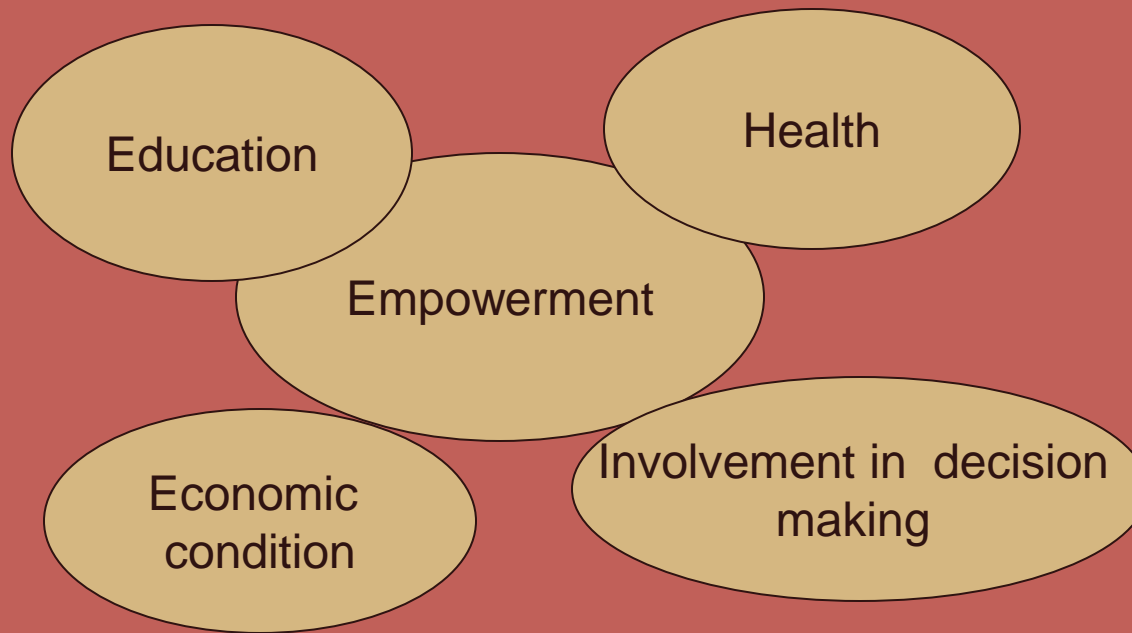


OPERATIONAL DEFINATIONS
