#### **Initial Project Aim**

To develop a multi-agency positive ageing and aged-friendly communities strategy.

#### Revised Project Aim

To develop a shared community-wide positive ageing and aged-friendly communities strategy for the region.

### Assumptions

- 1. That agencies, businesses, groups, clubs and associations are keen to be guided by a single strategy plan.
- 2. That the same will "sign up" and commit resources to a shared plan.
- 3. That a shared strategic plan produces greater efficiencies than single agency or service plans.






### Stage 1 - Results

#### **GUIDING PRINCIPLES**

By 2026 the number of older residents in the Macedon Ranges is expected to more than double. As the World Health Organisation (WHO) suggests, this is an opportunity to enhance the health, participation and security of older people, providing that governments, organisations and communities enact 'active ageing' policies.

Agencies across the Macedon Ranges Shire are collaborating to do just that! So far, community consultations have developed the Vision, Principles and Objectives of the Positive Ageing Strategy and ideas have been gathered ranging from the need to improve footpaths and community safety to developing a community hub and seniors cafe. We now need to respond to these ideas and work with older people to deliver age-friendly outcomes that meet local needs.

#### STRATEGIC OBJECTIVES

We do this by:

- Creating safe places for physical, emotional & social wellbeing: building better places to age well
- Supporting innovation & entrepreneurship: fostering ideas in the community for the community
- . Ensuring programs & services are accessible & welcoming
- · Encouraging lifelong learning & development
- Addressing social isolation: developing community connectedness and networks
- . Ensuring people & organisations in our community work together
- . Enabling local communities to address local issues

#### ACCOUNTABILITY, EVALUATION & REPORTING

How will we know if we're being successful? We think the best way is for people to come together at an Annual Macedon Ranges Positive Ageing Summit. At the summit, agencies can report on achievements and people can discuss what's working and what more needs to be done.

We will also develop a Macedon Ranges Positive Ageing Accord based on our Vision, Principles and Objectives, for agencies to sign. The range, outcomes and sustainability of projects that are initiated by our community and the number of groups which have signed the Accord will become key measures of success.
