Role of the Coordinator



- Provide assistance to members in fields such as IT, financial reporting and grant applications
- Organize monthly meetings, AGM and Christmas celebration
- Lobby with Federation members for policy change
- Organize speakers as per issues raised by Federation members
- Mentoring and encouraging members to represent themselves

Underpinning beliefs, political and theoretical orientation



- Ethnic seniors in Australia need a platform to voice their concerns
- English is their second language and thus, it creates a barrier in accessing mainstream services and information
- They are disadvantaged and marginalised due to age and ethnicity


