




AGE GROUPS OF COVID DECEASED







- > 52% of total are Elderly Death
- Gender Death 68% (M) 32% (F)
- > 43% of Covid deceased had NO comorbidities.





COVID 19 – Government Actions

- **❖ Nationwide Lockdown declared effective 25th March 2020.**
- **❖ Nation wide Awareness Campaign launched for Covid 19 precautions.**
- * Employers informed to pay wages to employees for Lockdown period.
- * Employers also informed NOT to retrench any employee during Lockdown.
- * Social Distancing & Mask wearing made compulsory.
- * Advisory issued by the Ministry for Elderly in Regional languages.
- * AROGYA SETU App launched & being promoted for individual safety
- > PM of India offered relief package of us\$ 260 bn. (10% of GDP)
- > Heavily subsidised Special Food scheme launched for Poor (BPL) now extended till November 2020.
- > Sudden exodus of Migrant workers posed a big challenge for authorities
- ➤ Unlock 01 commenced effective 1st June 2020
- > Economic activities are slowly getting to normal as Tax collections improve






Centre Strengthens State's Fight Against COVID-19 (1/2)



Over 2.02 crore N95 masks & 1.18 crore PPE kits distributed to States/UTs free of cost since 1st April



- 7.81 lakh PPEs and
 12.76 lakh N95 masks supplied in Delhi
- 11.78 lakh PPEs and 20.64 lakh N95 masks supplied in Maharashtra
- 5.39 lakh PPEs and
 9.81 lakh N95 masks
 supplied in Tamil Nadu

Over 6.12 crore HCQ tablets provided to States/UTs




- ➤ India has **1.3 Bn**. Population at present.
- ➤ India has Sr Citizens population at 10% of total i.e. **130 Mn**.
- ➤ MoSJE, has proposed outlay of Rs. 365 Cr. (us\$ 50 Mn.) for NAPSrC for FY 20-21.
- > The Ministry supports **512** Elder Care Homes, **26** MMUs, **11**Physiotherapy centres.
- ➤ Ministry has appointed 8 RRTCs (Regional Resource & Training Centers in the country. RRTC are responsible for Capacity Building of Elder Care Home, Training of Caregivers, Creating Awareness on Government Policies & Programmes etc.
- ➤ Under National Programme for Health Care of Elderly (NPHCE) 24,855 Primary Heath Centres and **5,335** Community Health Centres are operational country wide.
- ➤ There are 1,234 Sub Divisional / sub District Hospitals are operational with 13,750 Doctors and 36,809 paramedical staff.
- ➤ In additional **756** District hospitals are functioning with **24,676** Doctors and **85,19**4 paramedical staff.
- ➤ Also there are **900,000** ASHA workers (Accredited Social Health Activist) and **2,08,000** ANM (Auxiliary Nurse-Midwife) supporting health care system.




COVID 19 - Elderly Pilot Survey by JSF



- * 37% participants of age 75 yrs. & above
- 48% participants living with spouse
- 4% are living Alone
- **❖ 48% living with Family- Nuclear / Joint**
- **❖** 63% Male & 37% Female participated



Survey Findings



- > Pune has been known as Pensioner's Paradise
- Pune has 150 Sr. Citizen associations
- Associations connected elderly thru WA in lockdown
- Majority of urban elderly live in family environment
- > Yet 41% elderly were not Comfortable during lockdown
- > 2/3rd Elderly relied on Social Media & TV for Covid news
- > 60% Elderly engaged in creative work of own choice



COVID 19 : Survey Findings

PUNE SURVEY FINDING:

- ▶1.143 Mn. Citizens of the district (12%) surveyed.
- > 289 K visited fever clinics of which 11.2 K citizens were identified with Fever, Cough and Cold.

Ministry of Health & Family Welfare:


- The ministry has released official data about Covid-19 death analysis as per Age. It shows youth including children of age upto 29 yrs. are having 4% death rate, 30 44 yrs. have 11% rate while 45 59 yrs. are at 32%, 60-74 yrs. are at 39% and 75 plus have 14% death rate.
- Elderly are more vulnerable with 53 % death are.
- ➤ However the data also suggests, recovery rate has improved to 62%.

Livelihood of the Elderly Hit Hard:

- A survey finding suggests that , 65% of Elderly blamed lockdown caused by pandemic caused them loss of work and drastic loss of wages.
- ▶ 67% of the elderly in the age group 60-69 yrs. felt their livelihood suffered as Government guidelines suggested to preferably stay indoors to prevent them catching the viral infection.
- 90% of the elderly affected were working in unorganised sector and they need to continue working for survival.
- > 60% for elderly who lost livelihood were from Rural aras and 40% are from Urban areas..

Awareness of Covid-19:

- 91% of the respondents were aware of Signs and Symptoms Covid-19 suggests survey finding.
- ▶ 62% of respondents reported suffering from chronic diseases such as Asthma, Hyper Tension, Diabetes & Cancer.
- > 42% of the Elderly reported worsening of the health condition during lockdown.
- Elderly facing triple challenge- Health risk, Battling survival due to Loss of Income and coping with Social Isolation.
